



## HURON-PERTH BOYS AND GIRLS VOLLEYBALL

### AWARDS:

1. A maximum of 15 gold medallions, plus 1 manager, plus 1 coach  
A maximum of 15 silver medallions, plus 1 manager, plus 1 coach  
1 Junior Huron-Perth pennant  
1 Senior Huron-Perth pennant

### COMPETITION:

Note: In sports where there are six or more teams participating, league play shall be a single-game round robin format, unless any additional games beyond this are played outside of the instructional school day."

Note: SAC's, when setting schedules, need also to take into consideration the cost of their schedules.

1. There will be Junior and Senior competitions
2. League play will be interlocking, where each school shall play one 3-game match against every other school.
3. Standings and points earned are based on matches won. This will mean that a team needs to win 2/3 sets. We will still play three sets and regardless of the outcome in the first two sets, the third set will go up to 25 points.

### PLAY-OFFS:

1. The top 8 teams at the end of the regular season shall advance to the 1/4 finals
2. In the event of a tie, the match between the tied schools shall be the tie-breaker for advancing to the play-offs
3. The cost of the officials will be split between regular season and playoffs. Cost for playoffs will be split between all teams attending with the cost being based on distance travelled. Teams with higher bussing costs will be charged a smaller percentage of fees.
4. Play-Off Format is as follows:

We will keep our playoff off format below, with the top 8 teams qualifying with one minor adjustment. The losers from the 1/4 finals will play a second game to determine 5th and 7th place finish. These games will be played at the same time as the 1/2's. Each second round game, 1/2's and 5th place games will only have one official.

## **WOSSAA Qualifiers:**

- 1.)
  - i. Huron Perth Champion represents HP at WOSSAA
  - ii. If there is no champion in classification (A, AA, AAA) then the finalist represents HP at WOSSAA
  - iii. When two teams with the same classification are eliminated in the same round of playoffs (quarters/semis) and do not play each other in the Huron Perth playoffs, then a challenge match MAY occur.
    - i. If two teams that could challenge for WOSSAA are in playoffs and both eliminated in the quarterfinals, they would play their WOSSAA challenge match during the 'friendly' round of playoffs, regardless of who they were originally scheduled to play
    - ii. Only the 2 highest ranking teams can be involved in the challenge match
    - iii. Challenge matches will be held at the school of the higher ranking team, based on league standings, with the challenger paying for the cost of the referee(s). Challenge matches must be played on or before the Tuesday of the week of WOSSAA.
- 2.) Location of Qualifier(s) will be at the highest seeded team possible, at the discretion of the convenor.

Senior and Junior matches will be at the same location, if feasible.  
Qualifiers will be the Tuesday following the Huron-Perth Finals  
Officials costs will be shared by all schools at a site.  
All WOSSAA Qualifiers be played on same day and same location  
Challenges only when participation to be determined, not seeding

## **RULES:**

1. The rules of International Volleyball Federation as found in the Canadian Volleyball Annula Rule Book will be used except as hereinafter provided:
2. Fifteen players may be declared eligible for competition
3. Ejection of a player from a volleyball game will result in an automatic suspension from the next Huron-Perth match
4. The 12 substitutions rule shall be in effect
5. Net height for junior boys will be 2.35m and the junior girls net height will be 2.20m. (CVA U16 for junior and U18 for senior).

### Balls:

To be provided by the convenor's school, or a designate school at the discretion of the convenor

### Convenor Coverage:

Should the HP Boys/Girls Convenor's (season dependent) team fail to qualify for the playoffs, the convenor is still required to be present to ensure that the day runs smoothly, and without cause for concern.

### Financial Surplus

Any surplus will be re-funded to all schools.

### OFSAA Years

In years where HP is hosting OFSAA, the school hosting may use the HP Playoffs as a "dry run" for a successful OFSAA event. Where this is the case, the host OFSAA school will provide all scorekeepers, and linesperson, as well as employ the three ball system for all Senior Matches

### Unavailability of Agriplex

The Agriplex will be booked in June of the current year for next year's Playoff after the HP Draft schedule has been approved at the Huron Perth Athletic Association's June Meeting. If the Agriplex is unavailable on the requested day, then the above rules of Playoff hosting will be enforced, and no schools will be reimbursed for busing costs. The host schools will be responsible for supplying all

game balls, and scorekeepers.
