Huron Perth Volleyball 2024-2025

AWARDS:

- A maximum of 15 gold medallions, plus 1 manager, plus 1 coach A maximum of 15 silver medallions, plus 1 manager, plus 1 coach 1 Junior Huron-Perth pennant
 - 1 Senior Huron-Perth pennant

COMPETITION:

Note: In sports where there are six or more teams participating, league play shall be a single game round robin format, unless any additional games beyond this are played outside of the instructional school day."

Note: SAC's, when setting schedules, need also to take into consideration the cost of their schedules.

- 1. There will be Junior and Senior competitions
- 2. League play will be interlocking, where each school shall play one 3-game match against every other school.

3. Length of Matches:

- i) Regular Season: Best of 3 (25 points, no cap, game 3 25 points, no cap). All 3 games will be played even if the official match ends before the 3rd game. We will still play three sets and regardless of the outcome in the first two sets, the third set will go up to 25 points. (The exception for the 3 set will be if time is limited then both coaches and officials can decide to play 3rd to 15)
- ii) All playoff matches will be best of 5 (25 points, no cap, game 5 15 points, no cap)
- 4. Standings and points earned are based on matches won. This will mean that a team needs to win 2/3 sets. We will still play three sets and regardless of the outcome in the first two sets, the third set will go up to 25 points. (The exception for the 3 set will be if time is limited then both coaches and officials can decide to play 3rd to 15)
- 5. The ball will be permitted to touch the ceiling and other surfaces that overlap the playing surface (i.e. basketball nets) during rally play as long as the ball remains on the side of the team that last touched it. If a ball hits the ceiling and then goes to the other team's side it will be ruled a dead ball.

Tie Breaking Procedures for Regular Season

If two or more teams, at the end of the regular season the following criteria will be applied in order until all ties are broken, and all tied teams ranked. This means that if there is a tie among teams X, Y & Z and criteria b) is able to determine X as first, Y as second and Z as third, then no further criteria is needed. However, if criteria b) determines X as first (or third) and there is still a tie between Y & Z, then the ranking of the remaining teams will be determined by proceeding to criteria c) and so on, if necessary. Continue through the sequence of criteria and DO NOT start at a) again.

- a. The team having the best ratio of won/lost matches, considering matches played between the tied teams, will be ranked higher.
- b. The team having the best ratio of won/lost sets, considering matches played between the tied teams will be ranked higher.
- c. The team having the best ratio of won/lost sets, considering all matches of the season, will be ranked higher.
- d. The team having the best ratio of points for/against, considering matches played between the tied teams will be ranked higher.
- e. The team having the best ratio of points for/against, considering ALL matches played during the season, will be ranked higher.
- f. A coin toss by the league convenor.

Play-Off Format is as follows:

PLAY-OFF FORMAT

We will use off format below, with the top 6 teams qualifying with one minor adjustment. There will be NO friendlies after the semi final games.

Recommended times of the quarter and semi-final games will be as follows. The semi-finals will start at 10:30 and the semi-finals will start at 12:30. These times will be subject to change due to transportation issues for traveling schools.

The Junior and Senior Championship game times will be set by host schools in consultation with administration from both schools and head officials. When possible 1 game will be in the morning and the second game will be in the afternoon to allow for 1 officiating team to do both games.

RULES:

- 1. The rules of International Volleyball Federation as found in the Canadian Volleyball Annula Rule Book will be used except as hereinafter provided:
- 2. Fifteen players may be declared eligible for competition
- 3. Ejection of a player from a volleyball game, including 1 hour prior to and 1 hour after the match, will result in an automatic suspension from the next Huron-Perth match. If the ejection is the result of unsportsmanlike conduct they are ineligible for any further Huron-Perth competition, in any sport, until officially reinstated by a Board of Reference
- 4. The 12 substitutions rule shall be in effect
- 5. Net height for junior boys will be 2.35m and the junior girls net height will be 2.20m. (CVA U16 for junior and U18 for senior).

OFSAA Years

In years where HP is hosting OFSAA, the school hosting may use the HP Playoffs as a "dry run" for a successful OFSAA event. Where this is the case, the host OFSAA school will provide all scorekeepers, and linesperson, as well as employ the three ball system for all Senior Matches

Unavailability of Agriplex

The Agriplex will be booked in June of the current year for next year's Playoff after the HP Draft schedule has been approved at the Huron Perth Athletic Association's June Meeting. If the Agriplex is unavailable on the requested day, then the above rules of Playoff hosting will be

enforced, and no schools will be reimbursed for busing costs. The host schools will be responsible for supplying all game balls, and scorekeepers.
